Cali Coast Elite uses the united Scoresheet for most competitions. When creating teams for the season we base the team size off of the number of ADVANCED tumble passes the athletes can do. For example if we have 7 advanced / Elite tumble passes in a junior age range we will only take 11 kids on that specific team. This doesn't always apply to Level 1, since that is always the entry level. That means if your athlete does not have any elite passes in the level they are trying out for, they would be trying out as a stunter only and would NOT tumble in that routine. If they love to tumble and would like to tumble in the competition routine, they should be trying out for a level that they can do most of the Elite and Advanced passes for. If they are trying out as just a stunter, their placement would depend on the position we need most after we place the tumblers on the team.

For example: If placed 7 ELITE Level 3 tumblers on a Junior Level 3 team (all 7 showed Elite and Advanced passes with good technique at tryouts). We are now looking for 4 stunters to compliment the team. Are the 7 tumblers flyers, bases, or backspots? How can I make my two stunts groups? (we get the number 2 from the scoresheet of required stunts for 11 athletes. If we are missing 2 bases, and 2 backspots then those are the four additional people I am looking for to put on this team. Any extra "flyers" trying out for this specific level would not be able to join the team.

The best way for an athlete to level up to the level they want to achieve is to be successful in their Advanced/ Elite passes on the sheets, but that is NOT the only way to level up. Be the best you can be in your strong suit. Most of the time, the best jumpers, motions, and dancers move up faster.
